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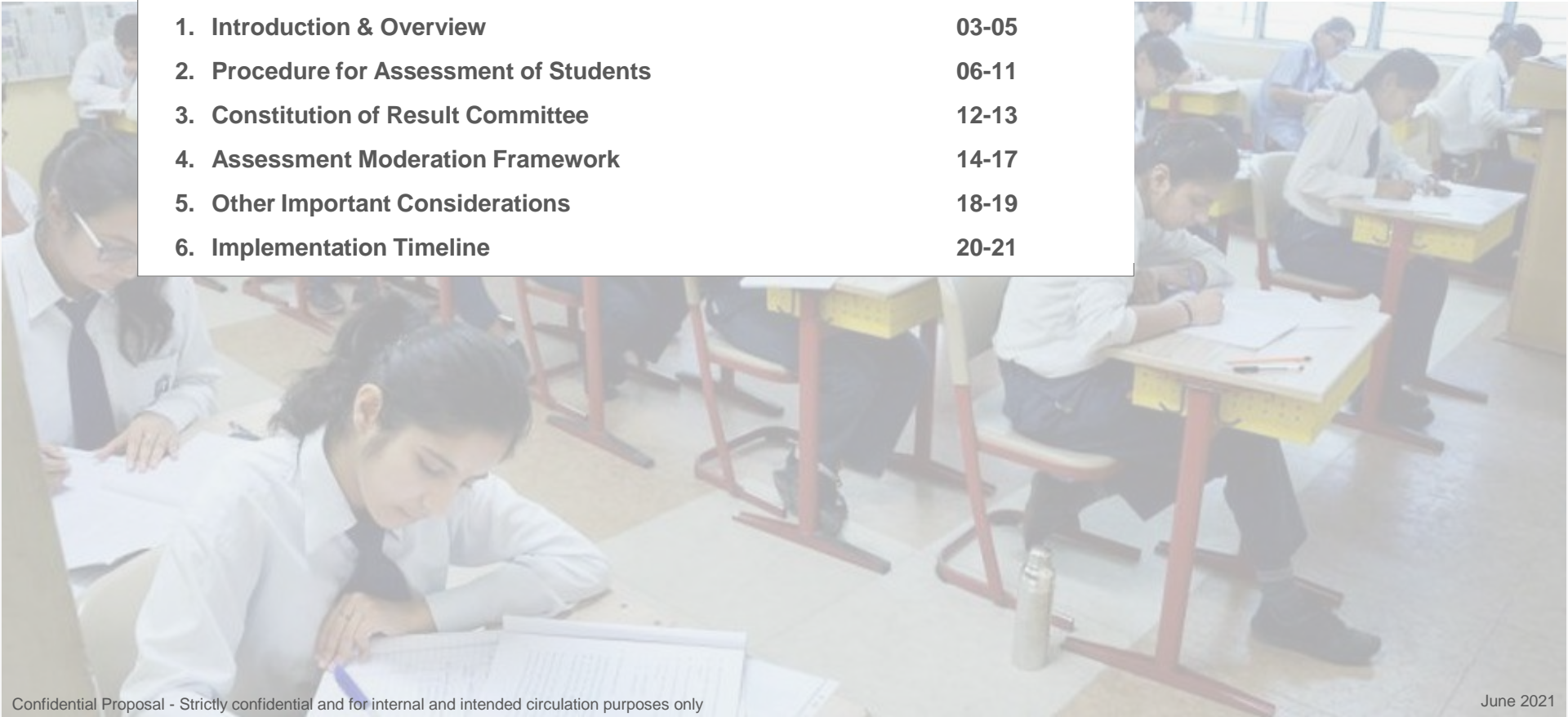
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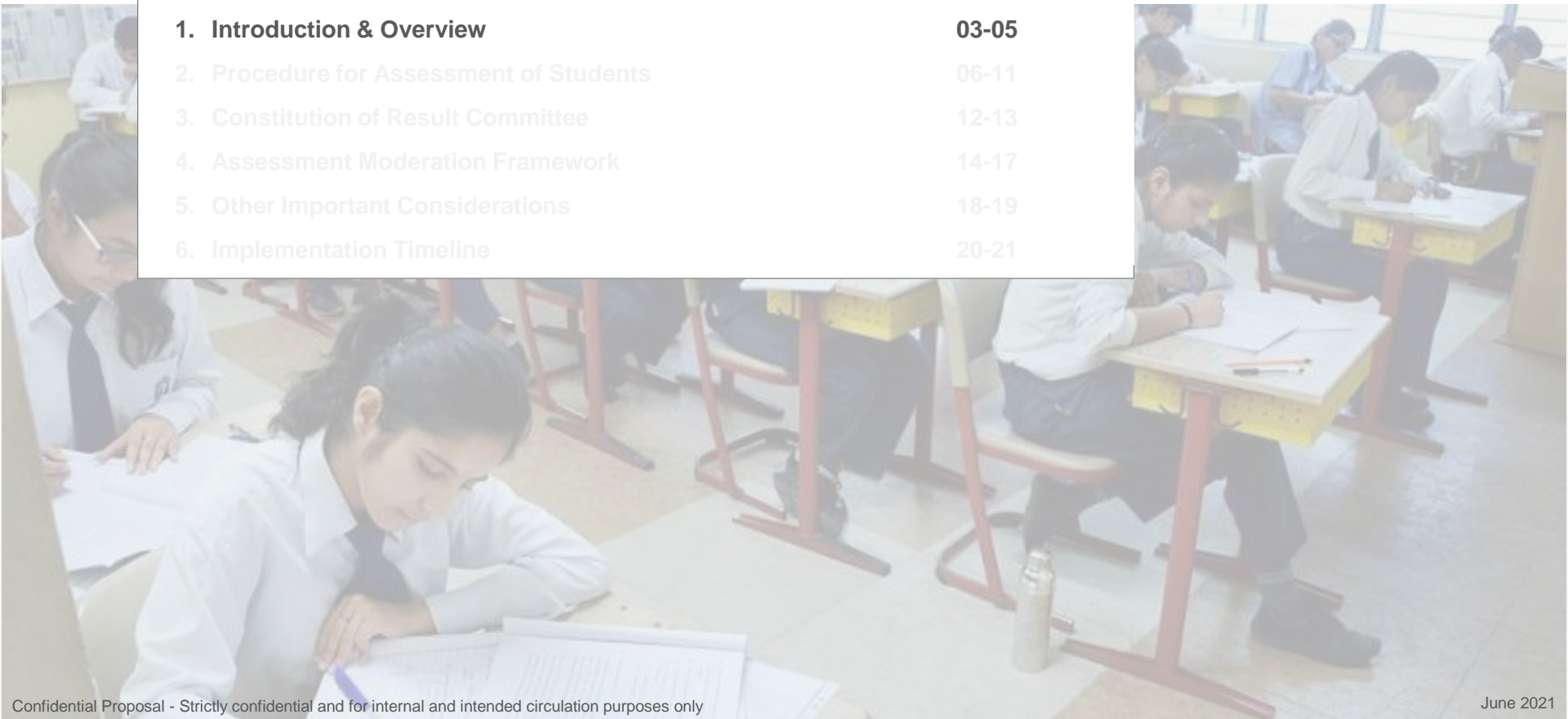
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# Introduction & Overview

In order to manage the conundrum of conducting examinations for class XII, CBSE has provided the framework summarized hereunder:

## BACKGROUND

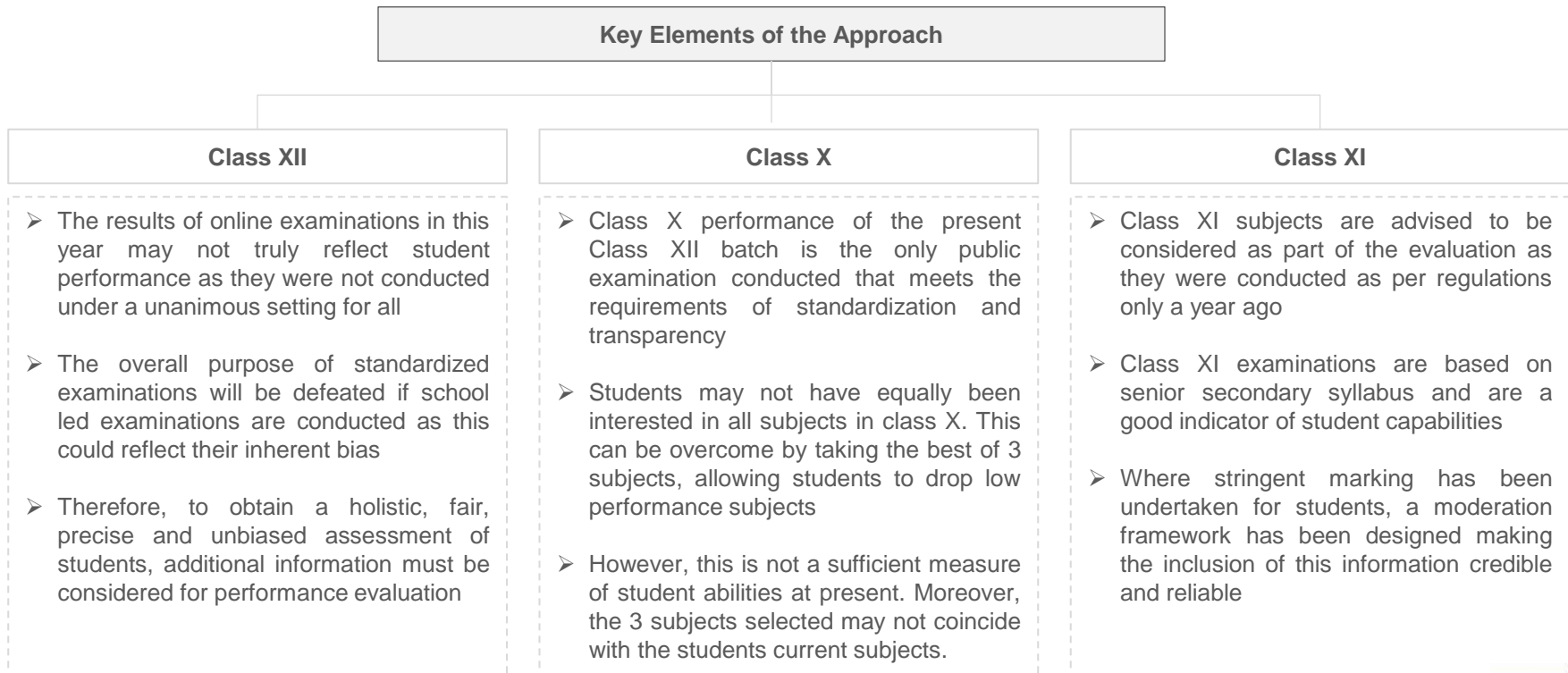
- In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, educational institutions have been deeply impacted akin to several other industries in the country.
- Consequently, CBSE has not been able to conduct board examinations for students in Class XII, keeping their health and safety in mind
- Given the current circumstances, a clear and emergent need of designing a framework to augment the conduct of examinations was realized and key challenges in the conduct of these examinations were identified to overcome the overall dilemma.

## Challenges Identified by CBSE

- Absence of a standardized system of evaluation across all schools
- No objective medium to ensure valid, reliable, fair and unbiased results to students in the pandemic situation
- Results calculated vide an approximation method will not be exactly at par with the results obtained through an actual examination
- The current assessment policies are not flexible enough to provide for sufficient credible and reliable information of the students, so as to arrive at precise conclusions of student performance

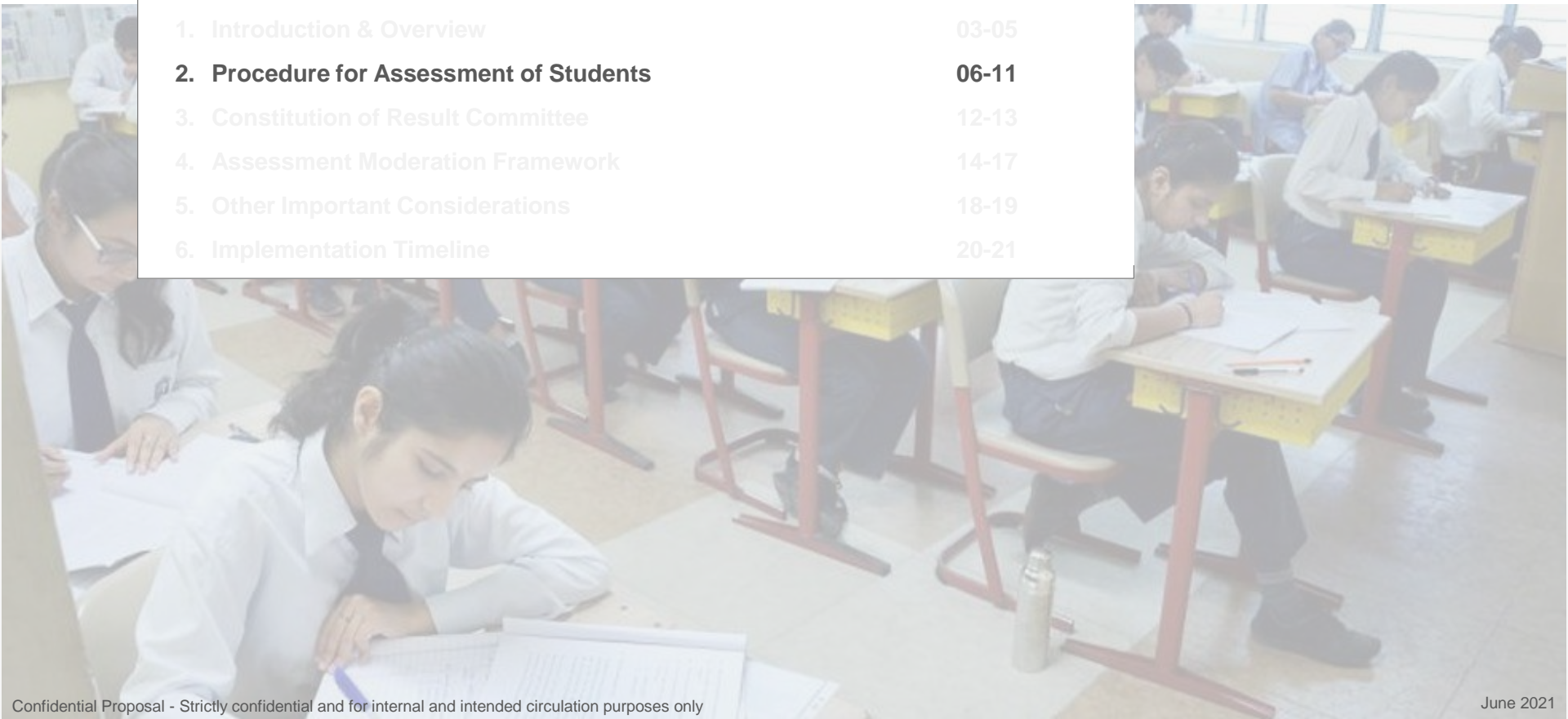
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# Procedure for Assessment of Students

## II. Evaluation As Per Revised Tabulation Policy, 2021

XII	Marks based on Unit Test / Mid-Term / Pre-Board exam	40%
XI	Marks based on theory component of final examination	30%
X	Marks based on theory component of best 3 out of 5 performing subjects	30%

**Note:** All schools must upload the marks of practical / internal examinations on the CBSE portal latest by 28 June 2021, for evaluation of results.

**Key Points to Note:**

- Computation of class X theory marks should be based on best 3 subjects out of 5 main subjects
- The average of these subjects will be awarded towards class XII performance evaluation as per the weightage assigned
- The board will provide the marks for class X theory performance of CBSE students for ease of reference
- For students of other boards, manual entry for class X performance will need to be made by the schools as per the marksheets available

**Key Points to Note:**

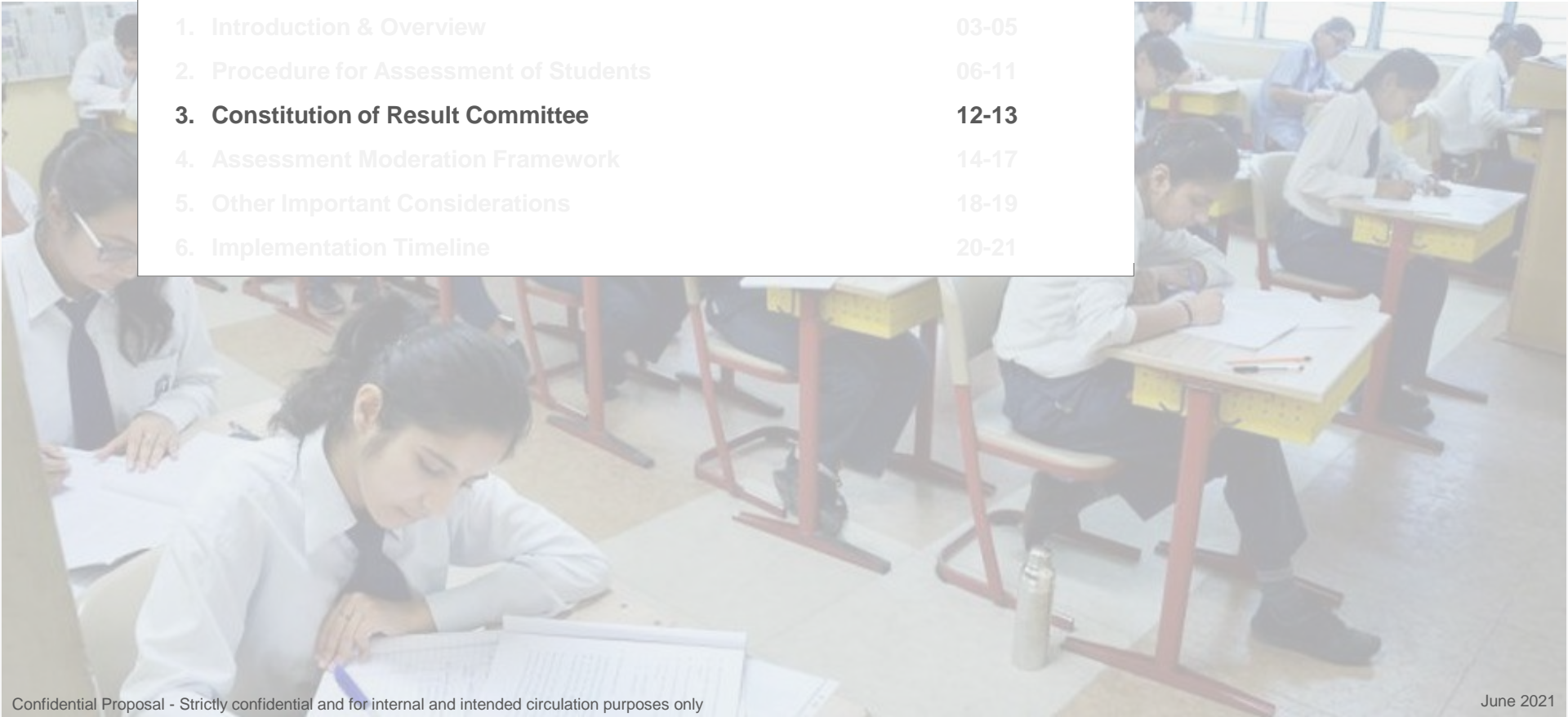
- Computation to be based on performance in one or more unit test / mid-term / pre-board theory examination
- The result committee will decide the weightage given to each exam. A rationale document must be filed and maintained by the school in this regard.
- The result committee will need to address underlying challenges for examinations conducted during 2020-21:
  - Differences in terms of mode of conduct of exam (online / offline)
  - Not all students have appeared for the examinations
- The result committee will be fully responsible for any decision taken after analysis and study of the situation prevailing in the school

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# Constitution of Result Committee

Every school will need to appoint a result committee as per the following prescribed framework

## 5 Member Result Committee\*

**Principal (Chairperson)**

**Senior most teacher of the school, teaching class XII (2)**

**Teachers of neighboring schools, teaching class XII (2)**

## Special Invitee

- A teacher with IT background may also be invited to the result committee to help with result computation
- Subject teachers may be invited to committee meetings as and when the performance of students in their subject is being evaluated / discussed / recorded.

## Member Honorarium

### Honorarium to paid by the board directly, as under

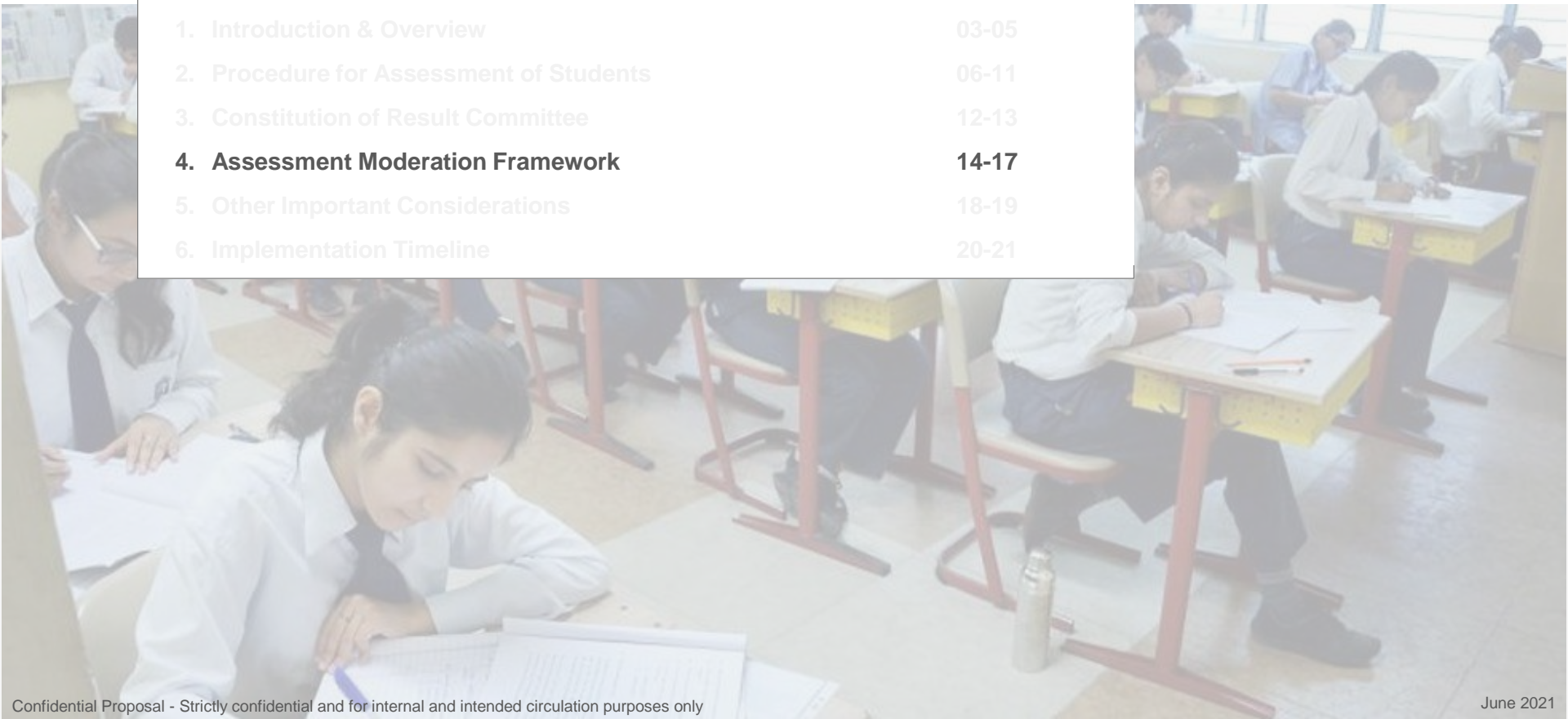
- External committee members – ₹2500 each
- Internal committee members - ₹1500 each
- IT teacher – ₹1500

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# Assessment Moderation Framework: Reference Year Selection

In order to standardize and facilitate result comparisons, CBSE has designed the following moderation policy to be applied by schools for evaluation

	Class X	Class XI	Class XII
Scaling Permissibility →	x	✓	✓

## I. Selection of Reference Year For Moderation

Previous 3 Academic Years	Avg. Performance
Year 1	71%
<b>Year 2</b>	<b>74%</b>
Year 3	72%

### Note:

- If data for 2 years is available, then best performing year between the 2 should be considered as reference year
- If data for 1 year is available, then the same shall be considered as reference year

- The historical\* performance of the school over the last 3 academic years will be considered for moderation
- The highest performance year will be selected as the reference year for moderation
- For each subject, the school will have to follow a broad distribution of marks which will be based on the performance of the specific year by the school in that subject. This will be provided by the Board.
- The moderated marks should be in the range of +/- 5 marks obtained by the students in the school in the subject of the reference year
- Subject wise moderated marks cannot exceed overall average marks by more than 2 in the reference year

# Assessment Moderation Framework: Illustration

In order to standardize and facilitate result comparisons, CBSE has designed the following moderation policy to be applied by schools for evaluation

## DISTRIBUTION OF MARKS PROVIDED BY THE BOARD

# Assessment Moderation Framework: Illustration

In order to standardize and facilitate result comparisons, CBSE has designed the following moderation policy to be applied by schools for evaluation

## In the example below

- The average marks indicated by the board are 62 for Mathematics. The school will have to ensure that the average moderated marks do not have a variance of more than +/- 5 marks i.e. between 57 to 67 marks
- The result committee will scale / revise the marks for Class XI or Class XII theory as per the requirement
- The overall average of all the subjects assessed should not exceed  $66+2=68$  marks

**Therefore, schools can allow a variance of 5 marks per subject, however the overall subject average for the reference year should not be exceeded by more than 2 marks**

## COMPUTATION FOR A SCHOOL WITH 200 STUDENTS

Average Marks in Mathematics – 62 +/- 5

Overall average in all subjects in reference year -  $\leq 66$

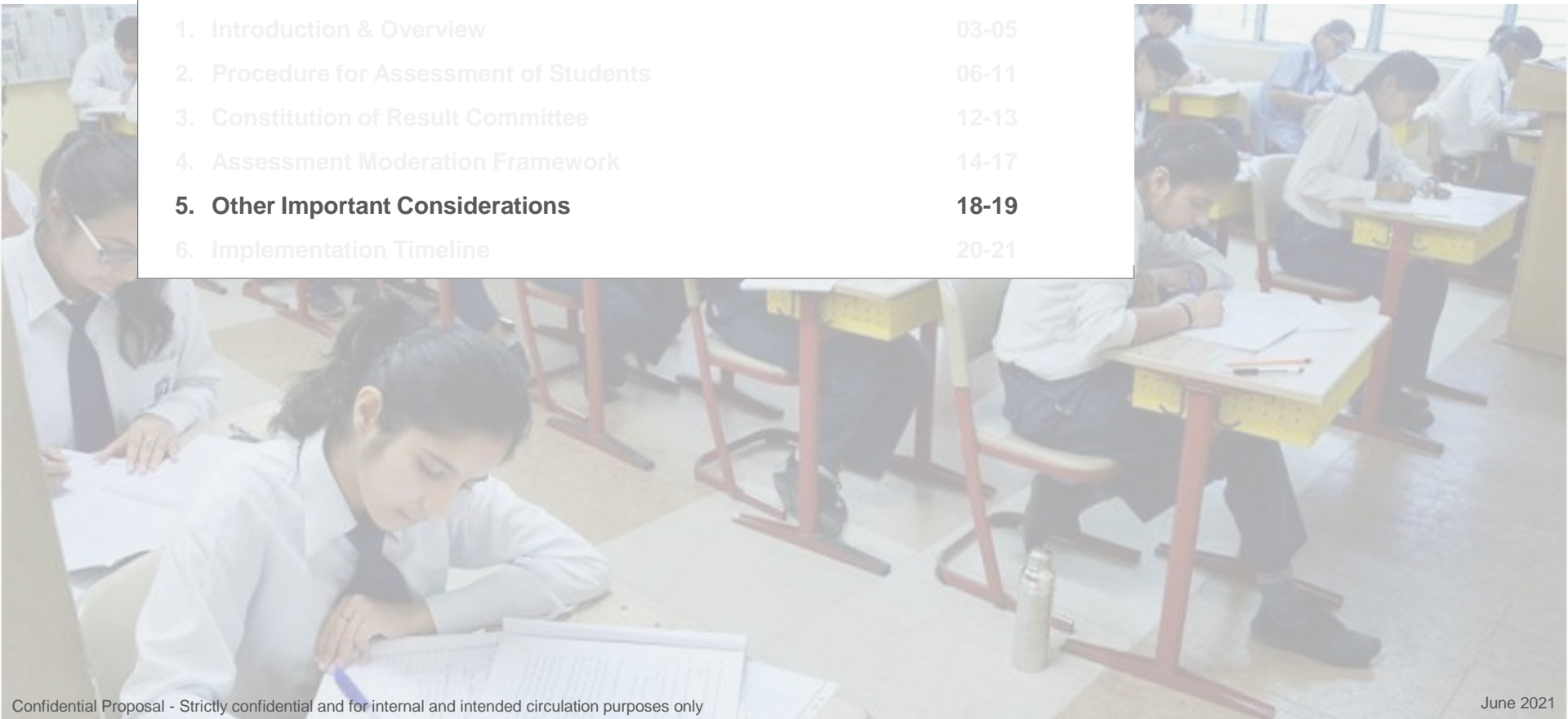

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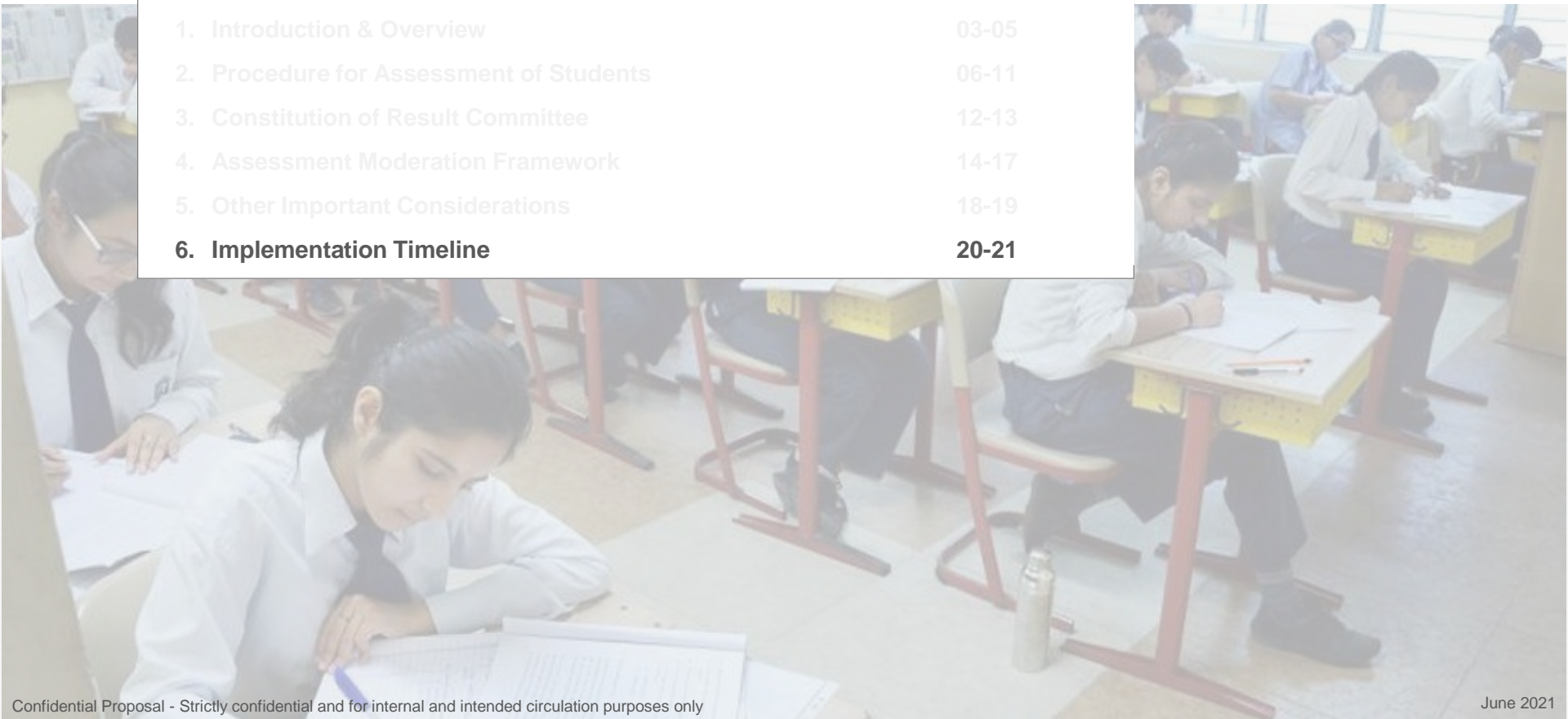
## Other Important Considerations

Considerations*	Details
Assessment of more than 5 subjects	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Mean marks of the best 3 subjects out of the maximum allotted marks after conversion may be awarded</li></ul>
Re-evaluation of Answer Book	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Not applicable for the academic session 2020-21</li></ul>
Safe keeping of records	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All important documentation regarding student performance and rationale document signed by the result committee should be kept sealed in custody of the Principal for subsequent verification</li></ul>
Non Compliance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Schools may face disaffiliation proceedings if there is non-compliance</li><li>• Financial penalties may be imposed</li><li>• Class XII results for the defaulting school will be withheld until the school complies with the requirements</li></ul>
Data Upload	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Schools will be accountable for the data uploaded to the portal. Data once uploaded will be final.</li></ul>
Support to the schools	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• CBSE will provide an online detail of school wise reference year marks as well as a provision to confirm whether the assessment is as per Board policy</li></ul>
Students not satisfied with the assessment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• CBSE will organize reassessment for such students once conditions are conducive for holding examinations</li></ul>

- *Finalization of roadmap and schedule by the committee*

15 July 2021

- *Finalization of result after moderation & checking by school*
- *Uploading marks to Board link*

## TIMELINE FOR CBSE

28 June 2021

- *Provision of subject wise, school wise distribution of marks as per previous board exams by CBSE*

08 July 2021

- *Availability of portal for uploading marks*

31 July 2021

- *Declaration of result by CBSE*
